# Gibson County Council Regular Session Agenda January 12, 2021

The Gibson County Council met in Regular Session on January 12, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. at the North Annex Meeting Room.

<u>Members Present:</u> Included Council Members: Jay Riley, Craig Pflug, William McConnell, Jeremy Overton, Derek McGraw, Dan Beard, and Michael Stilwell. Gibson County Auditor, Michael Watkins is also present.

The Council opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

<u>Election of 2021 Officers</u> - <u>Councilman Riley</u> motioned to appoint Jeremy Overton as Council President, seconded by Councilman McGraw. The vote was 7-0.

<u>Councilman McGraw</u> motioned to appoint Craig Pflug as Vice President, seconded by Councilman Stillwell. The vote was 7-0.

Councilman McConnell motioned to close nominations, seconded by Councilman McGraw.

### **Special Consideration**

Judge Krieg & Judge Meade were present to discuss a few issues. Judge Krieg began with overtime for the Court Reporters in the 2021 budget. He requested this line be re-instated for both Courts in the amount of \$10,000 per Court. Councilman Riley motioned to approve an Additional Appropriation Advertisement for both Courts (1000-36 and 41) in a total amount of \$20,000. The vote was 6-0, Councilman McConnell did not vote.

Next, Judge Krieg discussed the Pre-Trial Services Director's Salary. He explained the Supreme Court considers this position the same as a Probation Officer, as they have very similar responsibilities. Going forward, the job will require a bachelor's degree. When this position was created, he agreed to start her in a lower salary until gaining the experience. He is requesting the Council increase the Director's rate of pay beginning January 1, 2021 to the same rate of pay as a Probation Officer/with three (3) years of service. Councilman Riley worries the County is going to be in a position to pay a salary they have no control over. Councilman McGraw feels this position is responsible for more than a Probation Officer and should fall into the probation salary criteria, therefore Councilman McGraw motioned to approve this raise for the Pre-Trial Services Director, seconded by Councilman Stillwell. The vote was 6-0, Councilman McConnell did not vote.

The Probation Building was discussed next; they will have to choose between a remodel or a green field option. Landmark had to create plans for the green field option. When these plans are complete, a copy will be sent to everyone.

Courthouse Security is still in the planning stages and they hope to have something to present next week.

### Clerk's Report

November 30, 2020 was acknowledged by Council.

#### **Department Reports**

Engineer Holden reported the FEMA grants were almost all finished. The Railroad Crossing Grant is complete and closed. Community Crossings Grant 2020 is complete and closed. He is submitting an application for the 2021 grant today and should know in a couple of months if County will be awarded the grant. The Hopkins Park Grant is in process. The Federal Aid Bridge #74 Project is in the works; however, the County will not see this money until 2024/2025. Engineer Holden introduced the new Highway Department Superintendent, Brant Johnson. He spent 14 years at the highway department and is looking forward to working with the Council.

<u>Sheriff Bottoms</u> submitted his 2020 collections and jail population reports to the Council. The jail population today is 103.

EMA Director Hedges submitted an invoice from Landmark Engineering for services rendered September – December 2020 on building design for the COVID-19 Storage Building. The estimated cost of the building is \$450,000; the building could go right onto County owned land and the past and present Commissioners are on board with this idea. EMA wanted to use CARES Act money to build this building. Councilman Riley wonders if an addition to the Probation Building could be made for this purpose. EMA Director does not feel this is a good idea. President Overton does not feel the County should spend any more funds on this idea, as it is only an idea, at this time. Councilman Pflug motioned to pay the \$2,320 invoice to Landmark, however requested no future expense be incurred until it is decided how to utilize the CARES Act money, seconded by Councilman Beard. The vote was 6-0, Councilman McConnell did not vote.

This \$2320 will be added to the Additional Appropriation request for advertisement a bit later in the meeting.

Newly appointed EMS Director Pond was present; he has been with the County for 38 years. He presented the 12/2020 report; they have a 45.24% collection rate. This department would like to contract with a new collection agency. President Overton would like to share a contact for this service. Director Pond would like the Council to reinstate his Part time Billing Clerk, as this position is needed. This money will be transferred from the P/T AEMT line into the P/T Billing Clerk line; it will be handled in the transfer section later in the meeting. If money is needed later in the year, he will approach the Council for an additional appropriation at that time.

Health Department reports were presented by Judy Adams. She reviewed the COVID counts in Gibson County. The Vaccine Clinic starts tomorrow at the Fairgrounds. The Health Department is helping the elderly booking appointments if they have no internet. All bodies will be on board for this clinic. They have 200 doses to administer this week. The have applied for a \$20,000 grant for vaccine clinic staffing.

The Health Department is requesting an additional appropriation of \$32,000 to help fund the staffing and overtime. The Council decided to use the CARES ACT Funding for this additional. Councilman Stillwell motioned to advertise this \$32,000 Additional Appropriation with the CARES Act money in general fund, seconded by Councilman Pflug. The vote was 6-0, Councilman McConnell did not vote.

Old Business

Payment of KDDK invoice in the amount of \$78,266.15 - this should be paid from the EDIT Fund, line for APC/Zoning. A claim should be submitted.

## **New Business**

Appointment of representative for Fort Branch-Johnson Township Library - Chris Wallace was the new appointment in which the Council signed off on.

Gibson Solar Project, Representative Rick Reed asked the Council to table this item until the February Council Meeting, allowing time to work with newly elected officials. Mr. Reed told Council this is not the Elliot Solar Farm discussion. They were going to discuss a totally separate project with the Council. A new ERA will need to be established. This project will be referred to as the Gibson Solar Project. They are going to be covering the expenses from Ice Miller, Baker Tilly, and McDonald Law's professional services for both projects; the County will pay for the services and receive reimbursement from Tenaska for these incurring costs.

They encouraged the Council to use these professional services to get their questions answered. The County will set up a separate fund in the 9000 series to properly account for this money. Councilman McGraw motioned to table the Gibson Solar Project today, seconded by Councilman Riley. The vote was 6-0, Councilman McConnell did not vote.

Byron Sanders / Jail Project Councilman Overton explained the Council had been working with Mr. Sanders since October 2019. Mr. Sanders had previously worked with Posey, Vanderburgh, and Dubois County in their jail projects and non-compliance jail issues. Mr. Sanders works for \$75 per hour verified through a timecard compiling his work. Prior to doing the pre-design services, he will review all information the County has gathered to date. He will assure the data gleaned is well calibrated to arrive at the correct information to try and select the proper design firm. Mr. Sanders feels he will not exceed \$13,000 on pre-design services.

Councilman McGraw motioned to advertise for this \$13,000 additional appropriation in Fund 1233. This motion is recorded in the Additional Appropriation section. This will allow the Commissioners to move forward with a contract if they desire to do so. Councilman Riley asked Mr. Sanders if the county was still on track with the schedule. Mr. Sanders has a response letter regarding the lawsuit to show due diligence on the County's behalf.

<u>Councilman McGraw</u> motioned to adjourn this meeting, seconded by President Overton. The vote was 6-0, Councilman McConnell did not vote.
