The Gibson County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on March 1, 2022, at 5:30 p.m. at the North Annex Meeting Room.

Prayer was led by President Montgomery followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Members Present: President Kenneth Montgomery, Vice-President, Mary B. Key and Commissioner Warren Fleetwood

<u>MINUTES</u>: Minutes from the February 15, 2022 meeting were approved as presented. Commissioner Key motioned to approve minutes, seconded by Commissioner Fleetwood. With no further discussion, the motion carried 3-0.

<u>American Rescue Funds</u> – Debbie Bennett-Stearsman was present; she explained that Commissioners voted at their last meeting to place all ARPA funds into the lost revenue category. She is now required to report this in the fiscal plan. She has a plan showing how the monies will be divided. She requests the Commissioner's approve this plan tonight.

YMCA Naming – Cecil Bob Allen recently attended a meeting in which the question was asked how Toyota's name got onto the Gibson County YMCA; he was told Toyota donated \$1,000,000 and a contract was signed stating Toyota's name would be on the building.

<u>Soil and Water District</u> – SWCD offers free soil testing for one acre and less.

<u>Larry Michel</u> – asked if subdivisions are controlled by the stormwater ordinance. President Montgomery stated there is no stormwater ordinance at this time. There is a new stormwater ordinance being proposed on March 15, 2022.

<u>Railroad</u> – Attorney Spindler told everyone about a recent, long meeting with the railroad. They feel they have the railroad's attention and Attorney Spindler feels the railroad will try to make it right to the extent they can.
